## What is this product?

**Type:** Ordinary shares in the Company, which is a closed-ended public limited company incorporated in the United Kingdom. The Company was registered in England and Wales under the Companies Act 2006 on 24 October 2016.

**Objectives:** The Company will seek to generate long-term shareholder returns, predominantly in the form of sustainable income distributions from exposure to the life sciences industry.

The Company will seek to achieve its investment objective predominantly through direct or indirect exposure to Debt Assets. The Company may acquire Debt Assets directly from the entity issuing the Debt Asset (a "Borrower"), which may be (i) a company operating in the life sciences industry (a "LifeSci Company"); or (ii) an entity other than a LifeSci Company which directly or indirectly holds an interest in royalty rights to certain products, including any investment vehicle or special purpose vehicle ("Royalty Owner"); or in the secondary market. The Company may also invest in equity issued by a LifeSci Company, acquired directly from a LifeSci Company or in the secondary market.

The Company will seek to create a diversified portfolio of investments by investing across a range of different forms of Debt Assets issued by a variety of Borrowers. As used herein, "Debt Assets" means collectively, royalty debt instruments, priority royalty tranches, senior secured debt, unsecured debt, and credit linked notes.

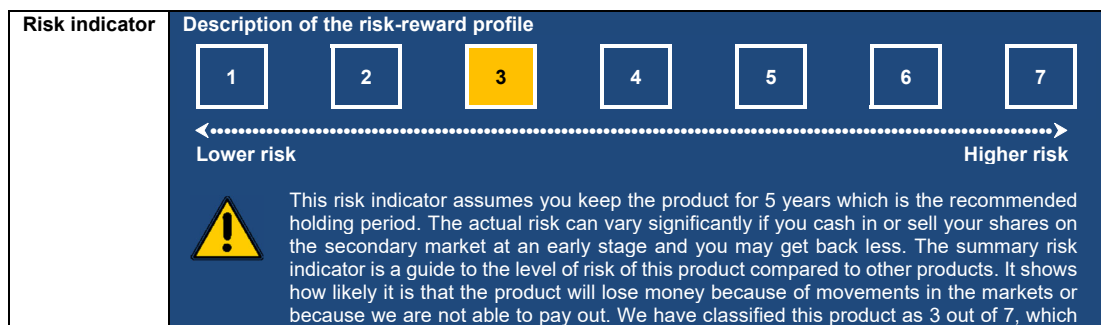
The Company does not propose to enter into any hedging or other derivative arrangements other than as may from time to time be considered appropriate for the purposes of efficient portfolio management and managing any exposure through its investments to currencies other than the US Dollar.

**Intended retail investor:** Investors in the Company are expected to be institutional investors, professional investors, professionally advised investors, highly knowledgeable investors who understand, or who have been advised of, the potential risks from investing in the Company, and retail clients.

**Maturity:** There is no maturity date.

### What happens if BioPharma Credit PLC is unable to pay out?

The ordinary shares are listed on the premium segment on the main market of the London Stock Exchange. Should the Company be liquidated, the amount you receive for your holding will be based on the value of assets available for distribution after all other liabilities have been paid.

### What are the costs?
